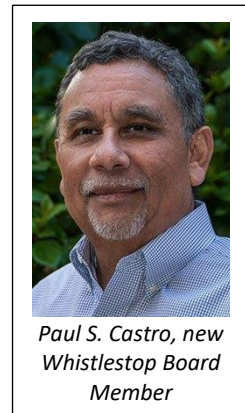


Sonoma State University with a Bachelor of Arts in environmental studies and planning, and holds a Master's in Business Administration from Dominican University of California.
